So, let us pray that through the grace of God people will see the value of life in each person and for the restoration of the dignity of the human life regardless of race, gender or beliefs. Also, Jocelyn will launching her new book "Hidden in the Shadow of Love: The story of Mother Theresa McLaughlin and our Lady's Nurses For the Poor. It will be launched by His Lordship Auxiliary Bishop Anthony Randazzo at the Congregation's home 35 Dudley St, Coogee at 11 am. All are welcome. A light lunch will be served afterwards. Fr Francisco

REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

THE NARROW GATE

Someone questions Jesus about the number who will be saved. He will not respond in quantitative terms ('How many ...?'). Rather, he turns the question back into a warning. Don't miss the opportunity while it is still available.

To make the point Jesus takes images from everyday life (without necessarily commending the behaviour involved!).

When an entrance or gateway is narrow and many are trying to get through, it pays to struggle and get to the front right away. We cannot just 'coast' into salvation; effort is required.

Travelers arriving late at a large household might hope for special consideration on the grounds of being known to the owner. But the lodging is full up with others who have got in before them. Imagine how they would then feel-out on the street for the night in a strange city, the door barred against them.

In the preaching of Jesus, we are all invited to the banquet of the Kingdom. But we can exclude ourselves from the banquet by not being prepared to accept that divine hospitality at the time-and in the company—of God's choosing.

The Gospel summons us to go in by 'the narrow gate', the gate that strips us of the various kinds of 'baggage' that selfishness loads upon us.

Those who daily take the message to heart can leave the question of salvation safely in the hands of the all-generous God, whose only desire in our regard is to have us as honoured guests at the banquet of
